

Usted tiene derechos constitucionales:

- No abra la puerta si un agente del servicio de inmigracion esta tocando a la puerta.
- No conteste ninguna pregunta del agente del servicio de inmigracion si el trata de hablar con usted. Usted tiene derecho a mantenerse callado. No tiene que dar su nombre al agente. Si está en el trabajo, pregunte al agente si está libre para salir y si el agente dice que sí, váyase. Usted tiene derecho de hablar con un abogado.
- No firme nada sin hablar con un abogado.
- Entregue esta tarjeta al agente. No abra la puerta.

Know Your Rights

If you encounter an Immigration and Customs Enforcement Officer at any Los Angeles Community College District location:

DO:

- Tear off the attached card and hand it to the officer
- Inform the agent(s) that the LASD has been contacted
- Remain calm and professional

DO NOT:

- Engage in casual conversation with the immigration officer

I do not give you permission to search any of my belongings based on my 4th Amendment rights.

I choose to exercise my constitutional rights.
