THE ACADEMIC SUCCESS ACTION PLAN (PROJECT A.S.A.P.)

The Academic Success Action Plan is a TRIO federally funded Student Support Services Program designed to improve the retention, transfer, and graduation rates of 125 selected students with disabilities.

Project A.S.A.P. offers the following services: Specialized Counseling, Transfer Assistance, Workshops, Mentorship Program, and Field Trips & Cultural Enrichment Activities.

DISABLED STUDENT PROGRAMS & SERVICES (DSPS)

The Disabled Student Programs and Services office strives to ensure every student with a disability at Los Angeles Harbor College experiences an academic journey that is accessible, enriching, and fulfilling. We believe in fostering equal and equitable opportunities while supporting our student's educational goals through dedicated support, reasonable accommodations, adaptive curriculum and instruction, and assistive technology.

ELIGIBILITY FOR DSPS SERVICES

Eligibility for support services, academic accommodations, and/or special class instruction will be determined by DSPS staff, in consultation with the student and will be based on the nature of the student's disability. In order to be eligible for support services, academic accommodations, and/or special class instruction authorized under Title 5, Section 56026, a student must have a verified disability, which must result in one or more educational limitations.

Disability verification can be obtained from physicians, psychologists, psychiatrists, therapists, audiologists, speech/language pathologists, social workers, and other qualified professionals.

Specialized Counseling courses that focus on College Survival Skills, Career Planning, and Interpersonal Relationships are available to students with disabilities.




HIGH TECH CENTER
